

Fr Terry Donnelly, C.S.Sp. RIP

September 2021 is a month we Spiritans cannot forget in a hurry after we lost our dear brother and priest Fr Terry Donnelly to the cold hands of death on the 7th of September. Fr Terry had to undergo a critical operation from which he was unable to recover, and passed over to God on 7th Sept at the age of 74. I am sure you can imagine the shock and great loss we have suffered here in our Spiritan community.

Fr Terry served in Sierra Leone, one of the most difficult missions in the world and he was passionate about serving disadvantaged people. He was a strong advocate of Justice, Peace and the care of God's creation. Always cheerful, he was ready to help anyone. I know he will appreciate your prayers as he prayed daily for you during his life. The world was a better place because of Fr Terry and heaven will be too. As we thank God for his life we pray for the strength to continue the mission of the Lord as he did. Always in our prayers.

A young and energetic student from the Delta State of Southern Nigeria has joined us for a couple of months to assist in the community, and also to benefit from the Scottish culture!


